## WHO WE ARE

**For 30 years**, MENTOR Virginia (formerly Virginia Mentoring Partnership) has been serving as the catalyst for the expansion of youth mentoring across Virginia. We are an independent, 501 (c) 3 organization that works closely with mentoring programs to help them build their capacity in order to provide high-quality mentoring programs and services for young people ages 5-24.

MENTOR Virginia is an affiliate of MENTOR: The National Mentoring Partnership.

**MENTOR Virginia (MVA) provides technical assistance and training to mentors and mentoring programs across Virginia.** One way we do this is by giving ongoing support to new and established programs through the National Mentoring Resource Center (NMRC).

Additionally, we continuously develop training programs and resourceful materials to prepare mentors and encourage networking in the field. We also collaborate with mentoring programs to assess their alignment with national quality standards and set growth goals via the National Quality Mentoring System.

Our Organization partners with mentoring programs and organizations each year to host AmeriCorps VISTA Members who build capacity for youth programs. Since 2012, we have hosted 11 cohorts.

We empower students through the Youth Ambassadors of Mentoring program. Selected high school students engaged in projects, advocacy, and training sessions during the year.

## Letter by Dr. Virginia Patterson

**Since 1993**, MENTOR Virginia has provided training and technical assistance to one-to-one mentoring programs for children in the Richmond area. The training, coaching, and educational support services we provide to our partners for our young people of Virginia are grounded in 30 years of research and best practices. It is through the generosity of our supporters and the direction of our board that we are fulfilling our mission to foster quality relationships that empower, elevate, and encourage young people, and strengthen communities.

In my first year as the Executive Director, I have seen the influence MENTOR Virginia has had in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Effective planning and matching have led to positive outcomes. We have been expanding our programs, broadening our reach, and providing more young people in our communities with positive mentoring relationships.

But our work is not done. We disseminated a survey to youth mentoring programs throughout Virginia and used the data collected to inform our decision-making, ensuring our program aligns with the needs of our partners. This data was instrumental in the development of our three-year strategic plan and the goals we have set to make our vision a reality:

1. Connect, guide, grow, and cultivate a network of mentoring programs across the state.
2. Help more people across Virginia understand that mentoring is impactful, and that MENTOR Virginia can facilitate opportunities to engage in meaningful mentoring relationships.
3. Develop our human and financial capacity to deliver exceptional services, innovate, and grow.

MENTOR Virginia is grateful to all our partners, funders, donors, and stakeholders for their past and future investment in helping us to deploy quality mentoring programs for children throughout Virginia. I am hopeful that we can continue our partnership to sustain the mentoring capacity of our young people. I look forward to connecting with you to provide further detail about how an investment in MENTOR Virginia will further our mutual goal of breaking through the barriers impeding the success of our young people and ensuring that each one who desires a mentor will have a mentor.

## NO COST-CONSULTING | TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE (TA)

Technical Assistance (TA) is an individualized program consultation service designed for mentoring programs that want to improve the quality of one or more aspects of their mentoring program. TA is made available to eligible youth mentoring programs at no cost through support from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. Below the areas of focus of TA Consulting:

# LATEST TRAINING-CURRICULUM

We've identified mentoring needs and gaps to develop new research-based training and resources.



**Deployment of Relationship-Centered Schools (RCS)** is an initiative aimed to create a transformative learning environment where every student is known and supported by caring adults and peers. By implementing the RCS curriculum vision, students experience increased empowerment, strengthened relationships, enhanced emotional well-being, and academic excellence. Teachers and staff reported greater job satisfaction, while parents noticed improved well-being and educational experiences for their children. The RCS training equipped educators with sustainable strategies, ensuring long-term positive impacts. This initiative demonstrates the power of relationships in nurturing student potential and fostering inclusive school communities.



**As part of the Virginia Talent and Opportunity Partnership (V-TOP) program,** we will be deploying the Connect | Focus | Grow curriculum, a crucial component of our initiative to connect Virginia students with work-based learning opportunities. The primary goal of V-TOP is to enhance talent pipelines in the state and improve talent retention by providing students with valuable career readiness skills. One of the key priorities of V-TOP is the development of content modules that address career readiness from both the student and employer perspectives, with a particular focus on fostering and maximizing the mentor relationship. Through the implementation of Connect | Focus | Grow, we will equip students and employers with the tools and strategies needed to create meaningful mentorship experiences, fostering a strong foundation for career success and talent development in Virginia.

# YOUTH AMBASSADORS OF MENTORING (YAMS)

YAMs are youths ages 14-18 from diverse communities in Virginia.



**Last year we launched the first-ever Youth Advisory Council**, which has since evolved into the Youth Ambassadors of Mentoring, with a mission to change how we serve youth by working alongside young adults as colleagues. Our Ambassadors are empowered to promote change and raise awareness about issues impacting them and their communities, and have had opportunities to engage in projects, advocacy, discussions, and monthly training programs. In 2022, YAMs provided valuable feedback about mentoring practices that affect them. By serving as advisors to MENTOR Virginia, the Youth Ambassadors strive to build partnerships with young individuals, adult decision-makers, and youth mentors.

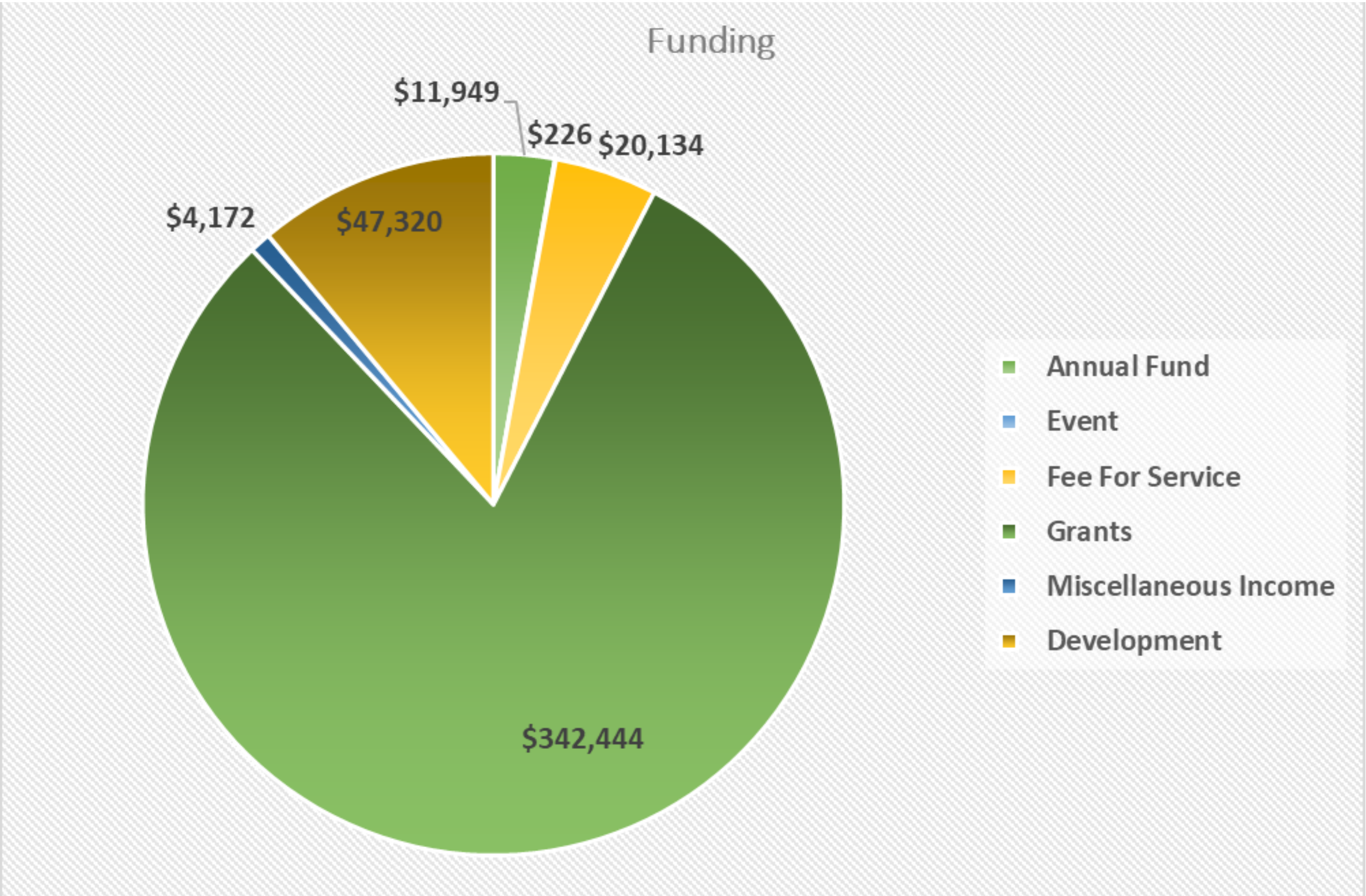

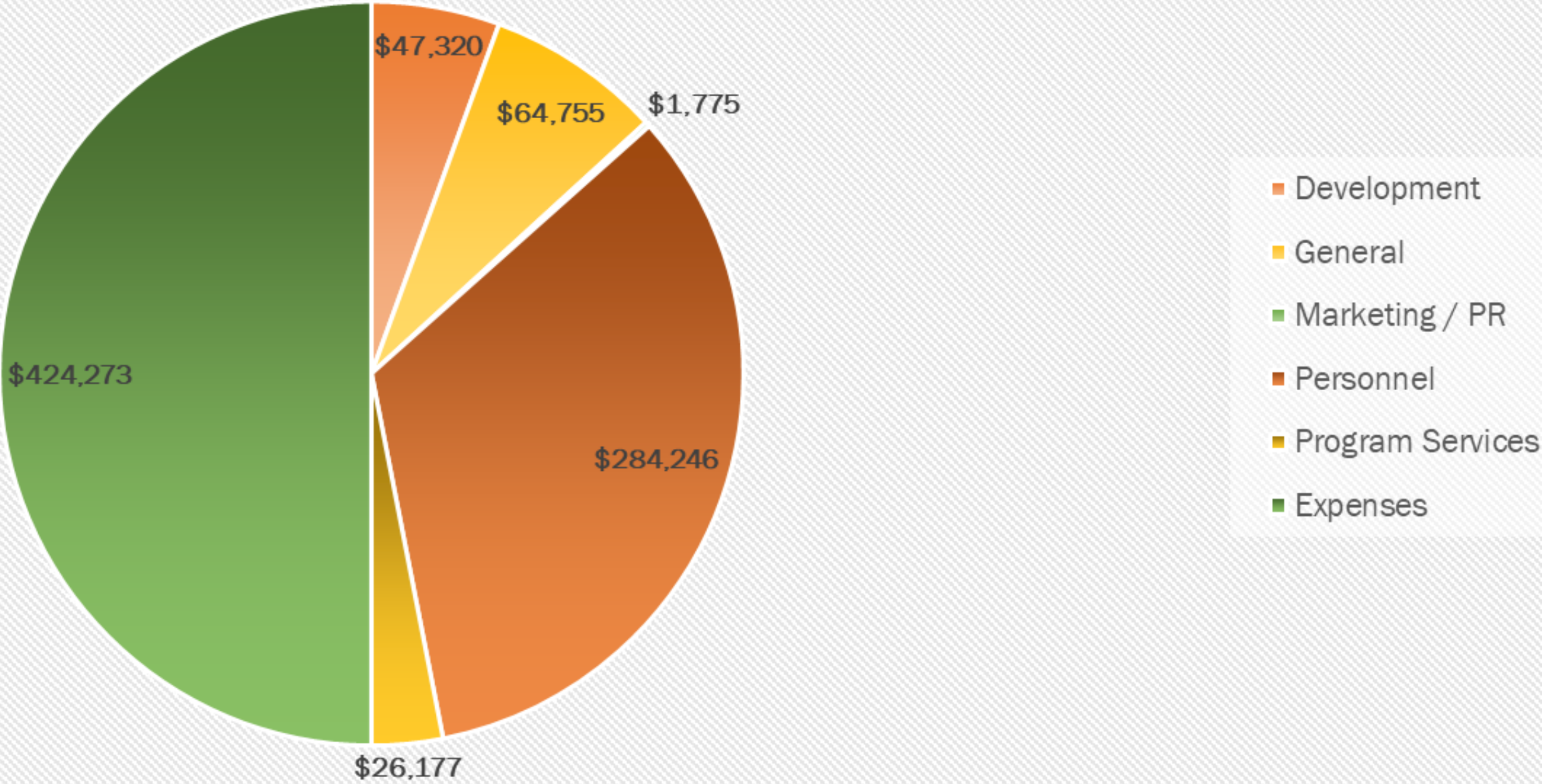
