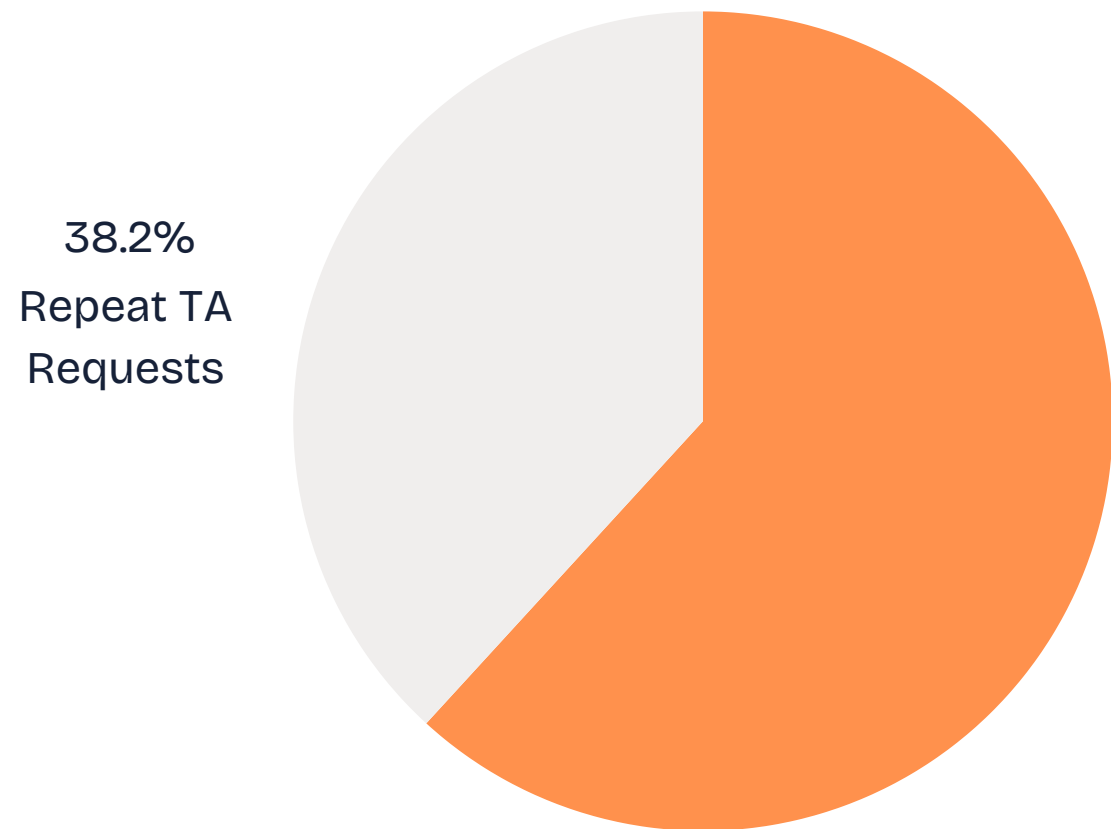
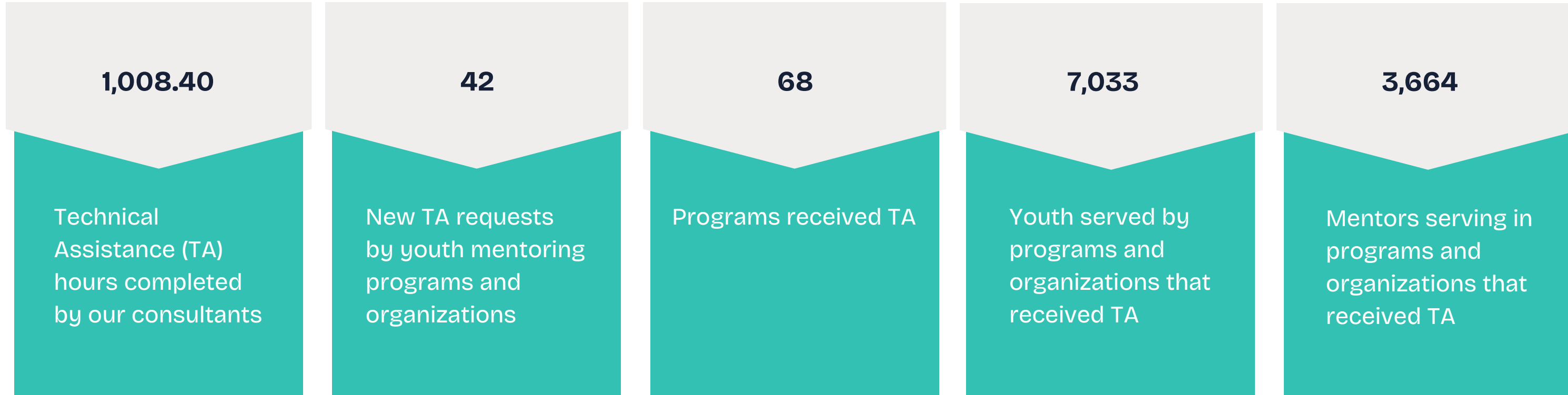

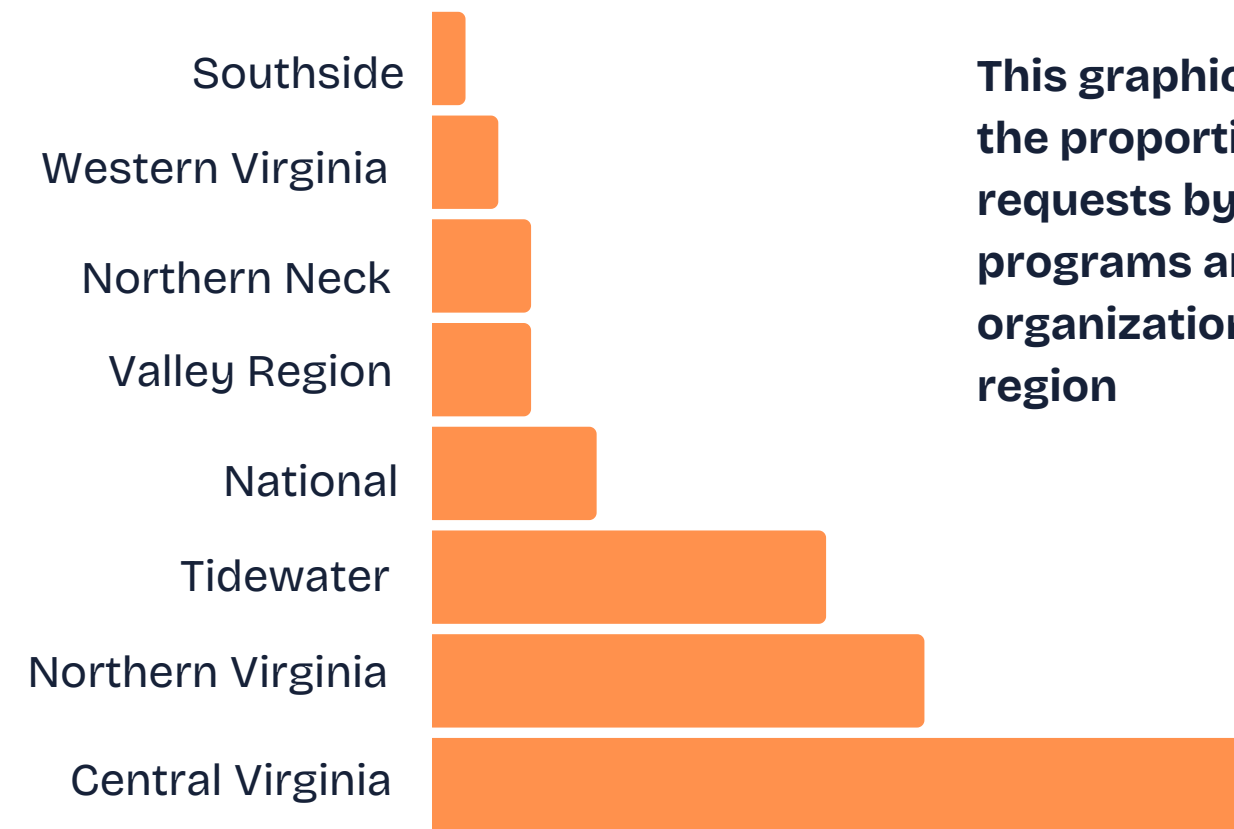

Training & Support: Expanding Quality Mentoring Relationships Across Virginia



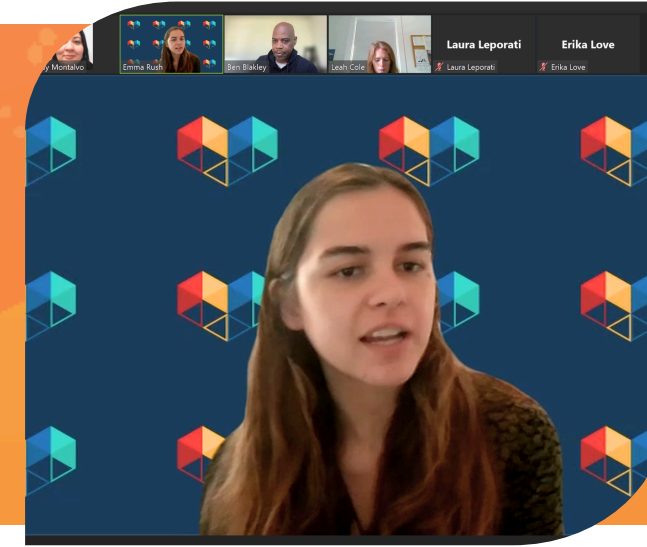

In the last six months, 40% of the training delivered was our Connect|Focus|Grow curriculum, 30% was around the “Relationship-Centered Schools” and the remaining 30% were custom-developed to meet specific needs.

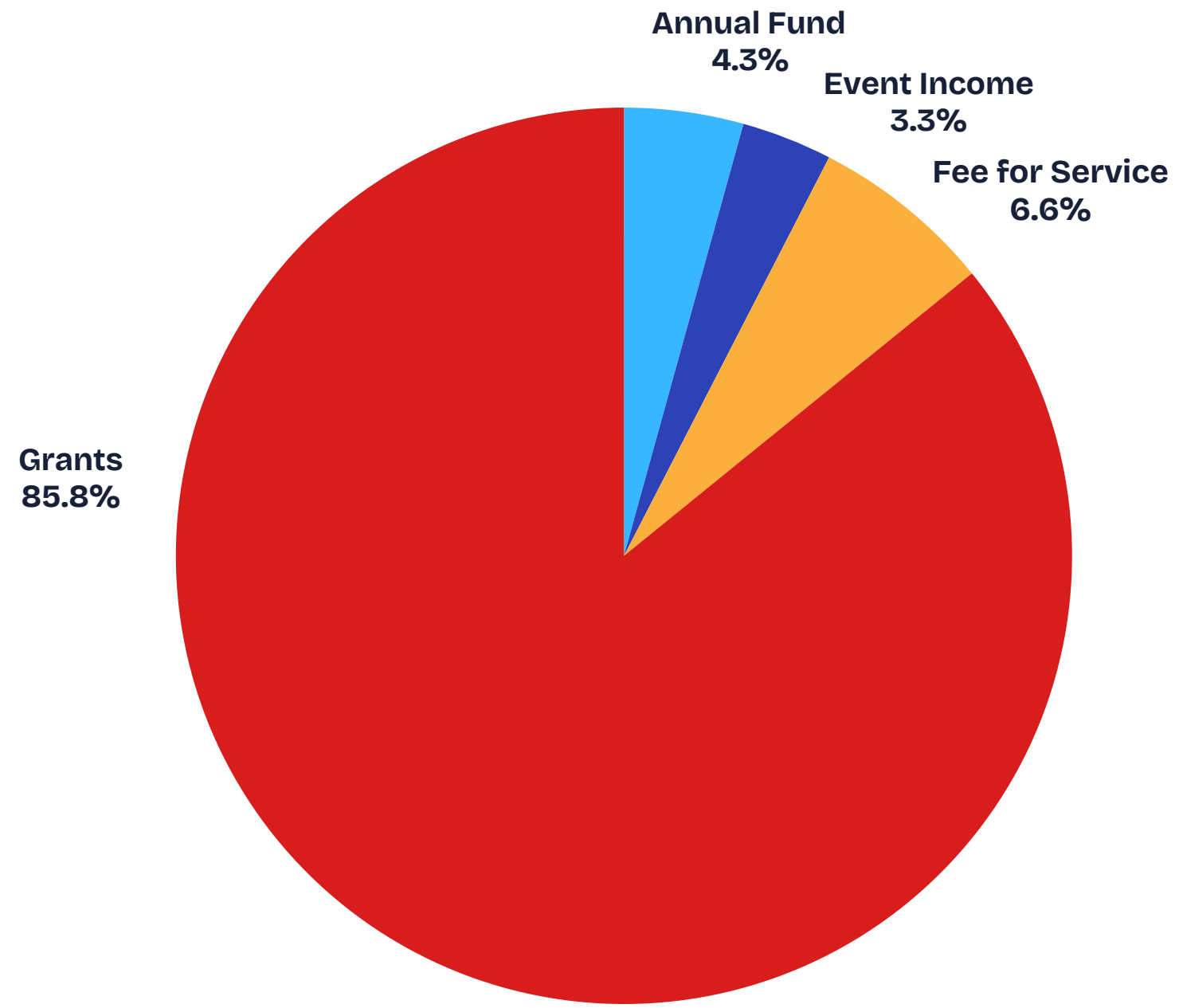

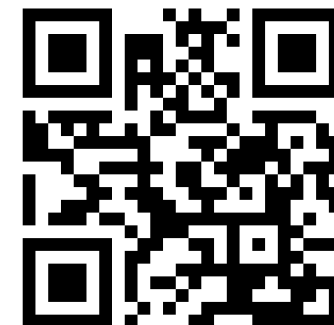
